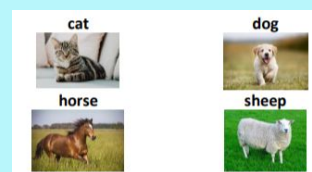

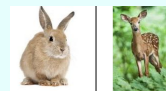

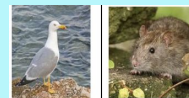

Key Vocabulary

fish

Animals that live in the water, breathe with gills and mostly have fins and scales.

reptile

Cold blooded animals that lay eggs and mostly have scales on their skin.

bird

Warm blooded animal that lays eggs, has a body covered in feathers and has wings. They have a beak and no teeth.

amphibian

A cold-blooded animal that spends time on land and in the water.

mammal

A warm blooded animal with a backbone and skin usually covered with hair or fur. It feeds its young with milk produced by the mother.

herbivore

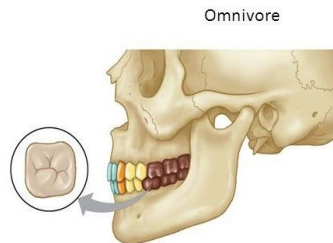
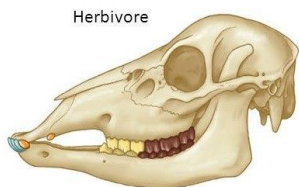
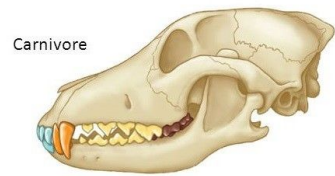
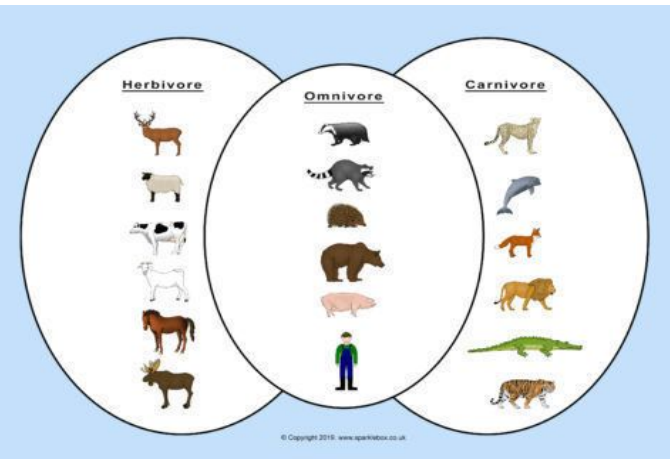
Animals that only eat plants.
