History

Look After Me: Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Elizabeth Garrett Anderson

Compare hospitals before and after Florence Nightingale arrived. Describe historical events relevant to the life of Florence Nightingale.

Describe other significant medical people from the past (Mary Seacole and Elizabeth Garrett Anderson) and how they impact us now.

Recognise that there are reasons why people in the past acted as they did.

Compare pictures or photographs of people or events in the past and discuss the reliability of photographs, accounts and stories. Ask questions by observing historical evidence.

Select from and use a wide range of materials and components.

Know and use technical vocabulary relevant to the project.

Learn about the Mosque and why it is important to Muslim people. Learn about how places of worship are similar and different. Ask questions about Easter.
